## Meeting the newest member of Rushen Silver Band...

*Emma Parsons has recently joined the main Band from Ballafesson Brass, and is our youngest member at age 12. Here's how she's found it so far...*



### **What made you decide to learn a brass instrument?**

**EP:** I decided to learn a brass instrument because I thought that it would be fun! (And it is!) Also I thought that violins are too screamy!

I was given the chance to learn brass in Year 4 at Scoill Phurt le Moirrey Primary School with Miss Cook and also had lessons on a Friday night with the Rushen Silver Band Tutors. By the end of Year 4 I had joined Ballafesson Brass, which I still like going to.

### **Who do you think you got your musical talents from?**

**EP:** My Mum - end of! My Grandad, Alwyn Collister, plays the saxophone and flute but my Mum has always been very musical playing a few different instruments and conducting choirs. I am the first brass player in the family though (on the tenor horn and the trumpet) - closely followed by my younger sister Heather on cornet. ### **What are your favourite types of music?**

**EP:** Well, I play in the Manx Youth Orchestra and the Castle Rushen High School Wind Band and Big Band. I was also in the band for The Wiz where I had to transpose all of the music.

I do tap and ballet twice a week and go to Guides. I play the piano as well and am working on my Grade 4 pieces. I also enjoy sport and am on the school netball team.

As I write this I am about to go on the Castle Rushen High School ski trip which I am really looking forward to as well. I can't really fit much more in!

## Rushen Silver Band are spreading their wings...

The 11th annual Borders Entertainment Contest for brass bands will be visiting Selkirk on Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> November. The Scottish Borders Brass Band Association (SBBBA) is organising the exciting event, and Rushen Silver Band has decided to venture across the water to enter the contest for the first time.



Rushen Silver Band will be joining bands from the Borders and other parts of Scotland. This is a fantastic opportunity for Rushen Silver Band to compete with 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> section bands from further afield than the usual Island brass community – meeting others from the brass band scene in the UK and learning more about performing in such a competition. It is also a great opportunity for the Band members to socialise together.

The plan is to hold a range of fundraising events before November to raise money to support the costs of taking the Band to the competition.

The Friends of Rushen Silver Band are holding a coffee morning on **Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> March** from **10am - 11.30am**, at St Catherine's Church Hall, Port Erin.
