New Instruments for Rushen Silver Band

Rushen Silver Band have been able to purchase some new instruments following the receipt of two very substantial donations.

The Band's fundraising organisation 'The Friends of Rushen Silver Band' has donated £3,000 to the Band, which has paid for a new Bass Trombone and a new Bass Drum.

The Gough Ritchie Charitable Trust has also donated £4,000 to the Band, which has enabled the purchase of a new B \flat Tuba.

Tom Sinden, Chairman of Rushen Silver Band: -

"We are extremely grateful to the Gough Ritchie Charitable Trust for their very generous donation.

We are a busy community Band, undertaking over 40 engagements last year, and donations such as this will help the Band to continue its work within the community around the Island. Buying new instruments is very costly, but the new B \flat Bass that the Gough Ritchie Charitable Trust's donation has enabled us to purchase, should serve the Band well for many years to come. "

The new Bass Trombone is currently being played by William King. The Band Secretary, Peter Faragher, is delighted to be playing the new B \flat Bass; he had been playing the previous Bass on and off for about 27 years!



Tom Sinden also commented, "The Band are also very fortunate to have the support of the 'Friends of Rushen Silver Band'. The 'Friends' raise funds throughout the year at coffee mornings and other events. The Band would like to take this opportunity to publicly

thank all of the members of the 'Friends of the Band' for their continued support, and also all the members of the public that have donated to the 'Friends' at their various events."

Young Musician of Mann 2015

The Band were well represented at the recent final of the Young Musician of Mann 2015. The contest, which is held at the Erin Arts Centre every two years, is open to instrumentalists under the age of 19. Band members Owen Williams and Toby Crossley were both involved.



Owen, who played a Mengascini Traditional Diatonic Accordion made in Italy, also played some of his own compositions in his set list for the final. Toby played B♭ Trumpet, and included in his set was the solo 'Misty' by Errol Garner, which he has played with the main Band on a number of occasions.

Owen achieved joint 2nd place in the final (coincidentally with Toby's sister Amelia who is a flautist); whilst Toby was awarded a special plaque in memory of Marian Shimmin as the most promising competitor.



The Band were sad to hear of the recent passing of Robbie Cooil. For members of the Band during the past twenty years, Robbie will probably be best remembered for his hospitality after the Band had been out carolling around Port St Mary. Invariably to finish the night, Robbie and his wife Doreen would invite the Band back to their home at Ballacreggan Farm for some nibbles, a drink and a warm after being out in the cold all evening.

Not only was Robbie was a member of the Band during the late 1950s and 1960s, but Robbie was also Band President during the 1990s. During his time in the Band, Robbie was also instrumental in obtaining good quality second hand instruments for the Band players during the 1960s through a contact he had in the UK.

Members of the Band stood for a minutes silence at a recent rehearsal. The Members and Friends of the Band would like to pass on their condolences to Robbie's family.
